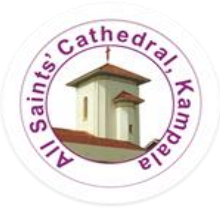


Women fighting over baby

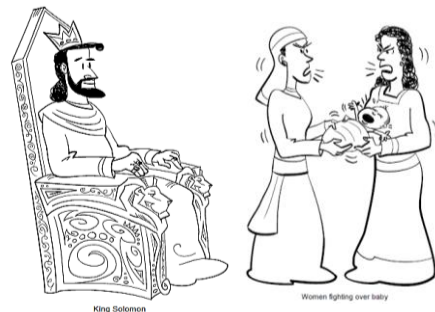
