ACP UPDATE FOR SUNDAYS - NOVEMBER/ DECEMBER, 2024

Finally, the new Cathedral was consecrated and opened for Worship on 01st November 2024. The new Sanctuary reached usable state and partial occupation was attained upon practical completion of the Interiors. The regulator granted Partial Occupation Permit prior to the consecration events.

As can be expected for any new building, we shall continue to improve what is not working out well under the building works and installations done so far while the Cathedral Management handles furnishing, audio-visual equipment, ICT and Security installations and other operational aspects for the Sanctuary.

Given that the Cathedral site is now occupied, the pending works will have to be carefully scheduled to minimize church ministry operations. Exterior Cladding Works to Slanting Walls and bell tower will commence in February 2025 while pending offices (on lower ground) and installations for functionality, will be done in a staggered approach.

Brethren, we thank you all for persistent Prayers, Participation, Provision and mobilizing Partners for this great work to see this momentous achievement in our generation. Let us continue running this race till it is fully done. Let us enjoy our new Cathedral!

Financial Status

We praise God that the funding gap on the Interior works was closed to cover the Interiors excluding inevitable variations encountered. The final lap to full completion of the new Cathedral expected to commence in February 2025 is estimated as follows:

- Exterior Wall Cladding = UGX 5 Billion
- Cathedral Offices and Installations = 1.7 Billion
- Lifts 2no. = UGX 0.8 Billion
- Total Estimate = UGX 7.5 Billion

Technical Status

Even if we have achieved partial completion and occupation, the project is still in the hands of Supervising Consultants and Contractors for works-in-progress in various areas.

- Currently, the Basements are being improved with terrazzo floor finishes and painting to provide a clean and user-friendly environment. The finishes to basement parking together with fire-fighting systems, plumbing and drainage works are expected to be completed by end of January 2025.
- Power Supply and back-up Generator including a transformer on main grid were installed.
- The Exterior wall finishing will be high grade cladding fixed on light aluminum framing with superior ultra-violet properties to minimize fading. This material selection is intended to give a low maintenance cost, self-cleansing and quality aesthetics suitable for this iconic Cathedral. The Exterior Cladding Works will commence in February 2025.

PROVOST'S MESSAGE

TOPIC: 'I WILL STAND AT MY WATCH POST...AND WAIT...' [HAB, 2:1-3]

Habakkuk 2:1-3, is a continuation of the dialogue between God and Habakkuk in a cycle where he complains and God answers in earlier Verses of chapter one. As we get to Chapter 2:1-3, we get to a very good break where Habakkuk now chooses to take the position to **Stand on his Watch post and wait for God to speak**. This time he does not record but just watches and waits for God to speak.

In this mood, God Gives Habakkuk instructions of what to do with the message that God is about to speak...Habakkuk here speaks again but now not to God but to the listeners... "I will stand on my guard post; I will station myself on the rampart; I will keep watch." The reason he will keep watch is "to see what He will speak to me and how I may reply when I am reproved" (which could mean that he will reply to others who will reprove him when he repeats God's prophecy about the judgment of the Chaldeans or that he will reply to God who will reprove him for his doubts and complaints).

The reason why Habakkuk **tells the reader** what he will do by using military phrases, *I will stand on my guard post is because* he wants us to learn from his actions, that *in Prayer we are not only required to go to God with our concerns and doubts but also wait on Him.* The Context here had a background in Chapter 1:12-17 where Habakkuk exhibits confusion, anger and exasperation because he does not understand God's actions in the middle of trouble.

Habakkuk just waits on Gods final say he did not run to others, He does not give up the faith - he does not become bitter. His instant reaction to the shock and horror by the Chaldeans is *to voice his complaint to God and then WAIT*.

Waiting on God helps us to give God a chance to answer our Prayers, to perfect us fully, for him to make us more useful in His Kingdom and for His presence to get into our lives and make us great for His Glory.

It is not really possible to wait on God on our own but when we get actively in matters that give Him Glory this may work out. It may not sound very practical but God is able through his salvation and presence to help us wait by serving:

- 1. By serving him continually
- 2. By Praying Continually
- 3. Reading the Word continually
- 4. By Attending Fellowships physically and online

God expects us to wait on him patiently even when nothing seems to make sense in life. As we conclude let us reflect on our passage for today:-

"I will stand at my watch and station myself on the ramparts; I will look to see what he will say to me, and what answer I am to give to this complaint.[a] 2 Then the Lord replied: "Write down the revelation and make it plain on tablets so that a herald[b] may run with it. For the revelation awaits an appointed time; it speaks of the end and will not prove false. Though it linger, wait for it; it[c] will certainly come and will not delay." (Habakkuk. 2:1-3)
