Phase 4 -The Final Completion Phase is now here. His Grace, the Archbishop and Bishop of the Diocese of Kampala signed the Contracts for the Completion Works and Installations on 30th June 2025. The two Contractors engaged will work concurrently starting July 2025. These are:

- AluClad Limited - Specialist Contractor for Exteriors Cladding and Stained Glazed Windows
- Costa Construction Services Ltd - General Building Contractor who will do the Offices, Lifts, Bell Tower, Signages and MEP Installations.

Given that the Cathedral site is now occupied, the on-coming works will be carefully scheduled to minimize church ministry operations. However, some inevitable inconvenience due to construction site activities may be experienced. Kindly bear with the discomfort for a little while as we strive to achieve the best for God's house which deserves to be finished well.

## TECHNICAL STATUS

### Defects Liability Period for Retiring Contracts (Phase 3)

After the new Cathedral was consecrated and opened for Worship on 01st November 2024 in usable state, the retiring contractors for Interior works have been serving the defects liability period while monitoring any construction defects to be rectified. We are in the final stages of signing-off the final admeasured works done for payment of balances and the contracts will be closed.

### Phase 4 Completion Works

The planned construction period is 15 months commencing July 2025.

The planned completion timeline is therefore October 2026.

The Exterior wall finishing will be high grade non-combustible (A1 fire-rated) Aluminum Composite cladding fixed on light aluminum framing with superior ultra-violet properties to minimize fading. This material selection is intended to give a low maintenance cost, self-cleaning and quality aesthetics suitable for this iconic Cathedral.

The Stained Glass Windows will be Laminated Tempered glass with Digital Printing design patterns infused within the heavy-duty glazing.

The Completion Building Works will involve the new Cathedral Offices at Lower ground level, Lifts, Bell Tower partitioning and finishes, Signages, Air-conditioning for closed rooms which have minimal access to external natural environment, MEP and other services installations.

Even if we achieved partial completion and occupation, the project is still in the hands of Supervising Consultants and Contractors for works-in-progress in various areas. Let us support them for the good of our own project.

## PROVOST'S PAGE

### ANCHORED IN CHRIST FOR UNITY, PEACE AND STABILITY (EPHESIANS 2:11-22)

As we begin the year celebrating the goodness of the Lord, struggling with challenges of life, looking forward to what God has in store for us in 2026, the Lord is challenging us in the Provincial theme to be “anchored in Christ for Unity, peace and Stability.” The question we need to answer as believers “Is Christ our Anchor?”

Mr. Google gives a very elaborate definition of our question today. Anchored in Christ” means having a deep, secure spiritual stability and hope in Jesus, like a ship held firm by its anchor in a storm, preventing drifting during life’s trials by trusting His promises, Word, and presence. It signifies reliance on Him, not self, for grounding, leading to unwavering faith, purpose, and access to God’s strength, even amidst challenges, representing a firm, unshakeable hope for an eternal future.

The anchor metaphor simply adds emphasis on the stability and safety of our faith in Christ as our hope. The author of Hebrews describes this hope as an anchor that is “firm and secure”, “sure and steadfast”, “strong and trustworthy”. A ship’s anchor allows the vessel to remain fixed and unmoving regardless of the conditions at sea. Our faith in Christ as written in James 1:6-8 should never be like a wave that is tossed in the sea. When one believes there should be no doubt at all. Just as an anchor stops a ship from drifting with the winds and currents, keeping our eyes on the hope of heaven as in 2 Corinthians 4:16-18 and the “pioneer and perfecter of our faith” Hebrews 12:2 who is Jesus Christ, will prevent our souls from wavering and wandering in times of pressure and turmoil. By grace in Christ Jesus, we are “born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, who by God’s power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials” (1 Peter:1:3-6).

As believers, we have “a living hope” and “hope as an anchor” that holds secure because it is fastened to the steadfast Word of God and the unchanging, reliable character of God. He is faithful, and His promises are true (Joshua 21:45, Psalm 33:4, Hebrews 10:23). Long wrote a commentary to Hebrews with this imagination about the anchor’s rope extending “from heaven’s heights back down to earth, where faithful people can ‘seize the hope set before us.’ Like rock climbers scaling an imposing height, Christians steady themselves by trusting God’s promises, holding on for dear life to this cord of hope” (Long, T., Hebrews, John Knox Press, 1997, p. 78). Holding on to the anchor is a daily choice and an active process which requires faith, commitment, and perseverance. A person anchored in Christ will be transformed and challenged daily to grow in Christ. It is Christ in us that we will experience peace, unity and stability in the body of Christ.
