

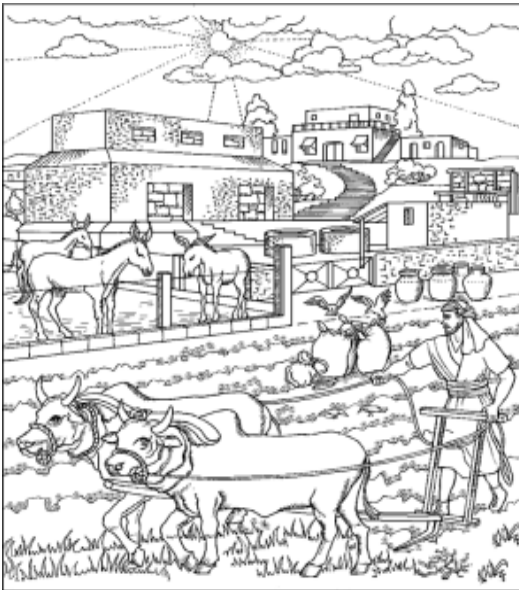

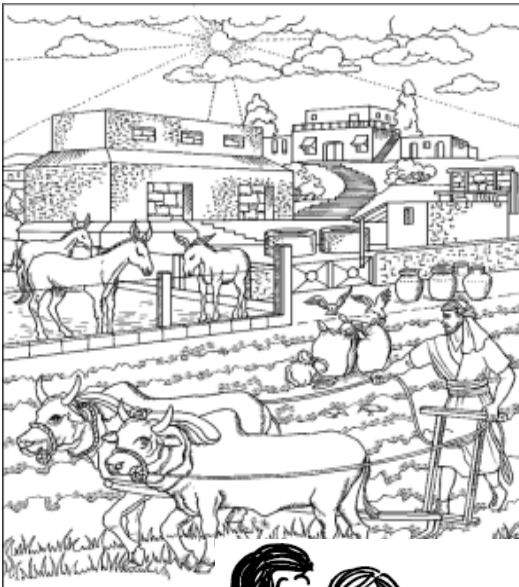

Point: We can be sure that God, who is in control of all things, will look after us even when bad things happen.



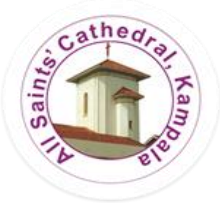

When bad things happen or there is sadness in our world, God is still in charge/control. **God can**, but

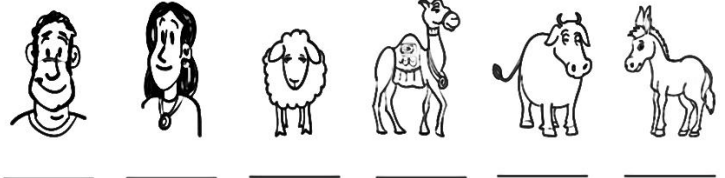

Job lost all his children, all his property and even got sick. Job was sad and tore his clothes, but he knew God was in charge/ control. So though he was sad, Job remained faithful to God. He knew

that God was in control even when those bad things happened. Even when he got sick and the wife told him to curse God and die, Job did not. Job trusted the Lord who he knew was in charge of his life and what was happening.



God is in control of everything that happens in this world. Satan had to get permission from the Lord; he could not do anything without God's permission. When bad things happen or there is sadness in our world, God

is still in charge. Sometimes the pain/ sadness is caused by other people, sometimes it is a disease, a natural disaster or an accident. **God can, but does not always** stop these bad things from happening. Instead, He uses them to grow our faith and help us trust him more. We can trust that God knows what he is doing, and will look after us, even when he allows sadness and pain in our lives, because he is in control.

So when you face a problem/ challenge, remember that God is in control and trust him to look after you even in that situation.
