Point: The birth of Jesus is the sign that God will rescue those who fully trust in him.



King Ahaz of Judah was about to be attacked by two kings and he was scared. God sent a message through prophet Isaiah telling him not to be scared and that he would help him.

King Ahaz did not believe God. Instead he asked another king for help. God was not pleased with Ahaz.

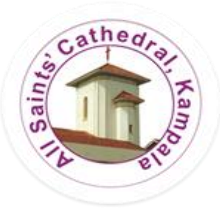

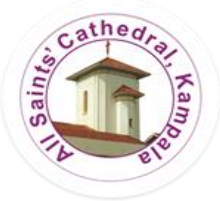

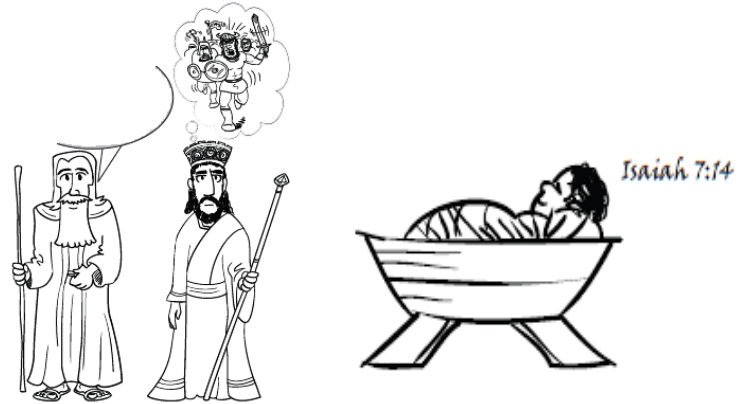
