



Read about it from Luke 23:13-49

After Jesus ate the Passover meal with his disciples, he went to pray in the garden of Gethsemane. There he was betrayed by Judas and arrested. He was questioned by the council of the Jewish elders, then sent to Pilate.

The Jewish religious leaders accused Jesus of stirring

up trouble by speaking against the Roman rulers. Pilate could find no basis for a charge, so he sent Jesus to Herod because Jesus was a Galilean (23:4-7). Jesus refused to answer any of Herod's many questions. Then Jesus was mocked and sent back to Pilate.

Jesus was tried and found innocent, but the crowd still managed to get him condemned while a guilty man, Barabbas, was released.

Jesus was taken outside the city to a hill and nailed to a cross. They also punished two thieves that day. While on the cross, one thief mocked Jesus while the other

pleaded for mercy. The thief who pleaded for mercy got it because Jesus was dying for his sin too.


