Lesson: THE LOST SHEEP

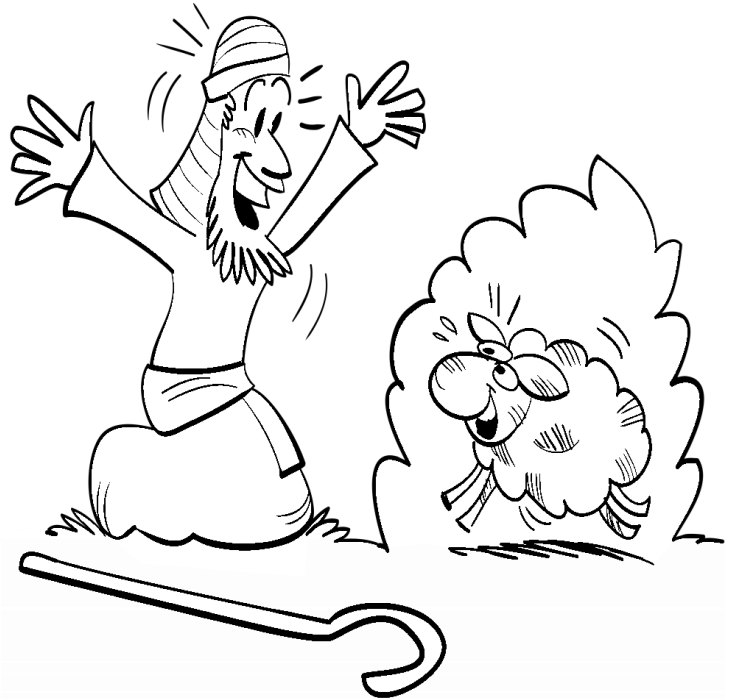
Reference: Luke 15:1-7

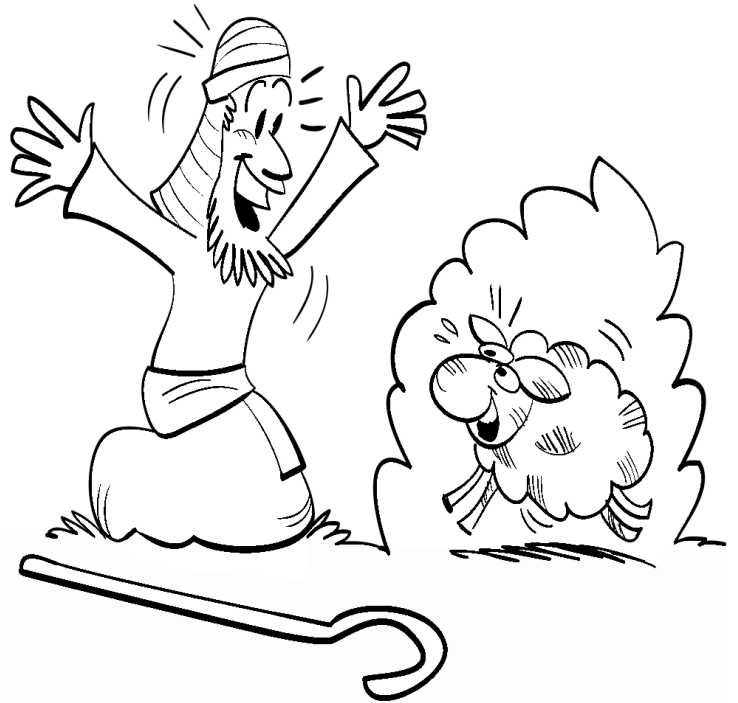
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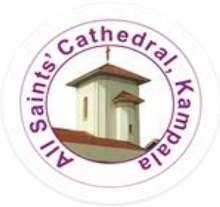
Jesus told a parable(story) about a man celebrating when he found his lost sheep.

Lesson: THE LOST SHEEP

Reference: Luke 15:1-7

Point: God rejoices whenever someone is saved; we should rejoice with him.

Read the full event from Luke 15:1-7

Tax collectors and sinners came to hear Jesus preach, but the Pharisees and teachers of the law did not want Jesus associating with them.

Jesus told them a parable about a man finding his lost sheep to teach that God rejoices over every sinner who repents. That explained why Jesus was spending time with sinners.

Jesus told the Pharisees and teachers of the law, through the parable, that God rejoices whenever someone is saved and we should rejoice with him. That was true then, and is still true today.

God is just like the man who found the lost sheep. He rejoices (is happy) every time one sinner says sorry for the way they have treated him and trusts in Jesus. We should be happy when this happens and celebrate with God too!

Think: Have you been found or are you like the lost sheep that needed to be found? Have you believed in Jesus and decided to follow him?

What can you do about other lost people?

Challenge: Celebrate with God whenever someone decides to follow Jesus. Also, tell others about Jesus so that they can repent and follow him.

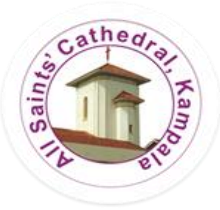
