### TOPIC: JEREMIAH-Called before his birth.

Jeremiah 1:4-19

#### INTRODUCTION

- Jeremiah was called at a difficult time when King Josiah's reformation had failed because people continued in their corrupt nature andS worship of idols. <u>Leaders</u> rejected <u>God's law</u> and the <u>will of the</u> <u>people</u>.
- Because of this sin three things happened.
   [Consequences of their sin]
- 1. Jerusalem city was destroyed. *Their identity*.

- 2. The temple was ruined. The presence of God departed from them.
- 3. People were captured and carried off to Babylon as slaves. Many people here are captured in Witchcraft, alcoholism, etc you're here shining outside when inside your enslaved.
- Beloved! Sin enslaves, torments and destroys.
- That exactly what happens if a family or any institution rejects God. 'mention the three'
- Out of this mess, God calls Jeremiah as a messenger of Revival and Restoration

# The purpose of Jeremiah's calling

- The purpose of his calling is elaborated in Jer 1:10 'see, today I appoint you over nations and kingdoms to <u>uproot</u> and <u>tear down</u>, to <u>destroy</u> and <u>overthrow</u>, to <u>build</u> and to <u>plant</u>'.
- Three pairs of verbs are mentioned here;
- First pair. To uproot and tear down. To raise a godly generation, there are foundations, traditions, systems and cultures that you must first deal with in all spheres like families, church and a nation. Uproot and tear them down.

- Second pair, To destroy and overthrow.
   After uprooting, there is need to destroy and overthrow any attachment to sin or wicked systems, traditions and cultures.
- The third Pair, To build and plant a new systems or orders. 'After destructions of all bondages and its wickedness, then God would lead His people in a new future, a new covenant and a new Hope'.

- This is our hope, that God will raise everyone here with a Jeremiah anointing ready to restore godliness, in the families, church, Nation, [Executive, Legislature and Judiciary].
- May godliness reign in Education sector, Health sector, security agencies. Let godliness reign in Political and religious spheres.
- Like Jeremiah's excuses (Jer 1:5), many of us struggle to take on new challenges because of lack of self-confidence, inadequate experience etc.

## Lessons to note in Jeremiah's call

- 1. We are all special and created in the image of God and called for a purpose. Some to be Pastors, businesspeople, politicians, musicians, security personnel name it... to do the will of God on earth as it is in heaven. There is a Jeremiah seated right here, and God is saying today, before I formed you, in your mothers womb I knew you. I have set you a part as my ambassador. v5
- 2. Assurance of God's presence v8. As God promised to be with Jeremiah so He will be with you. Jer 1:8.'Do not be afraid of them, for lam with you and will rescue you, declares the Lord.

- 3. Regardless of your short comings God can still use you. Just obey Like Jeremiah's excuses (Jer 1:5), many of us struggle to take on new challenges because of lack of self-confidence, inadequate experience etc. I know the one I have believed and is able.
- 4. He empowers those He calls. V9
- 5. He gives them authority to accomplish His mission.
- 6. Obedience V17. He obeyed and God used Him
- 7. He Established you as fortified city V18-19
- 8. Grants you Victory V19

- 4. without fear or favor
- 5. determined to overthrow ungodly traditions, systems and cultures that have hindered people from seeing Jesus Christ as their Lord and savior. A transformed generation is what God is seeking today. To stand up against evil and bring transformation.

#### conclusion
