2.0 Seeking the Lord

"A French philosopher who visited our shores when America was a new young nation left a similar warning. Alexis De Tocqueville said he came to the United States to learn what magic quality enabled a handful of people to defeat the mighty British Empire twice in 35 years. He looked for the greatness of America in her harbors and rivers, her fertile fields and boundless forests, mines and other natural resources. He studied America's schools, her Congress, and her matchless Constitution without comprehending America's power. Not, until he went into the churches of America and heard pulpits "aflame with righteousness" did he understand the secret of her genius and strength. De Tocqueville returned to France and wrote: "America is great because America is good, and if America ever ceases to be good,

America will cease to be great." John Stormer, Death of a Nation, 1968

Humility, prayer, and repentance

a) Returning to the Lord. Turning away from idolatry and all forms of disobedience.

In Uganda we have to deal with the issue secularism. We are increasingly believing too much in the intellectuals and the rich people and nations with money.

It also entails returning to the Lord from acts of disobedience

b) Prayer and repentance. Forsaking the evil waysa Prophet Joel puts it this way:

15 Blow the trumpet in Zion; consecrate a fast; call a solemn assembly;

16 gather the people. Consecrate the congregation; assemble the elders; gather the children, even nursing infants. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her chamber.

17 Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep and say, "Spare your people, O LORD, and make not your heritage a reproach, a byword

- among the nations. Why should they say among the peoples, 'Where is their God?'' Joel 2:15-17
- c) Aligning our lives with God's principles of righteousness and justice integrity, social justice, etc Isaiah 58 makes this point

3.0 Connecting with Jesus the Healer

- 25 And there was a woman who had had a discharge of blood for twelve years, 26 and who had suffered much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was no better but rather grew worse. 27 She had heard the reports about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his garment. 28 For she said, "If I touch even his garments, I will be made well." 29 And immediately the flow of blood dried up, and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. Mark 5:25-29
 - i. Jesus is the ultimate sacrifice. Because of His death and resurrection, we can be healed.
 - 5 But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed. Isaiah 53:5
 - ♣ He deals with all the effects of iniquity. Its effect on our
 physical lives and communities. When Jesus is welcomed in a
 warring and dysfunctional home He brings healing.

- ii. Jesus as the reconciler He is the mediator between God and Man. Uganda needs Jesus. Uganda must be in a right relationship with Jesus. Especially those who have walked away from God in disobedience, Jesus can reconcile you to Him. Those who feel like they have betrayed God, He will do for you what He did for that thief on the cross.
- iii. You need to connect with Jesus personally touch His garment,
 He only heals those who reach out intentionally those of His own
 town were not as blessed. Do not miss the blessings of the
