

When Job faced these problems, he was sad and tore his clothes, but he knew that it is God who gives and takes away. He knew that God was in charge/ control. So though he was sad, he worshipped God and did not blame God for what happened.

Even when he got sick and the wife told him to curse God and die, Job did not. In his suffering, Job did not sin against God, he remained faithful to him. Job trusted the Lord who he knew was in charge of his life and what was happening.

God is in control of everything that happens in this world. Satan had to get permission from the Lord; he could not do anything without God's permission. When bad things happen or there is sadness in our world, God is still in charge. Sometimes the pain/sadness is caused by other people, sometimes it is a disease, a natural disaster or an accident. God can, but does not always stop these bad things from happening. He uses them to grow our faith and help us trust him more. We can trust that God knows what he is doing, and will look after us, even when he allows sadness and pain in our lives, because he is in control.
