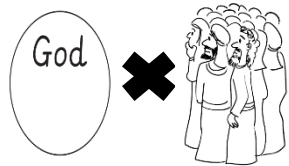
We could not get close to God. But Jesus died as a perfect sacrifice pay for our sin and is the perfect priest to represent us to God. He understands us because he lived on earth.
