



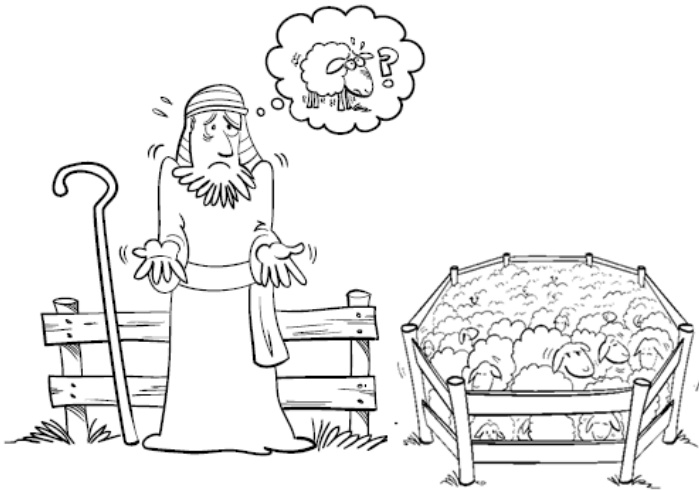

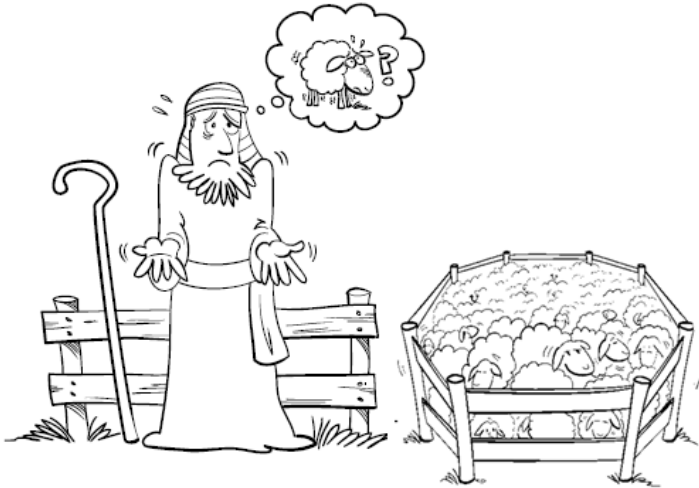

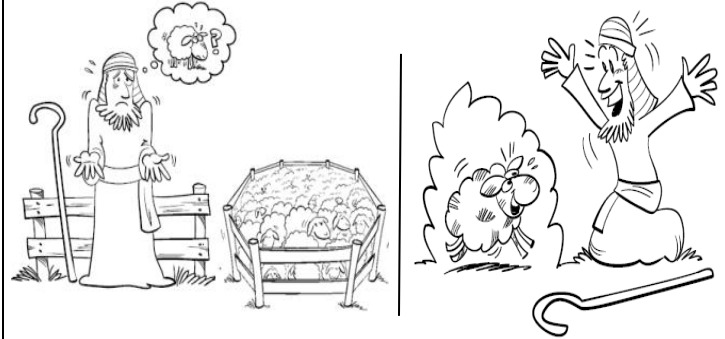
Tax collectors and sinners came to hear Jesus preach, but the Pharisees and teachers of the law did not want Jesus associating with them.
